## PASTOR'S MESSAGE

The year 2020 will be one that many people will want to forget. The pandemic COVID-19 has caused havoc to all parts of our world. It has affected our work, social, family and religious gatherings. The coming Christmas season will be different from the usual joyous family and religious gatherings.

Our Christmas Eve service will be limited due to stricter public health regulations. Both First Lutheran and St. Matthew's will only be permitted 30% of the maximum capacity of people for worship to ensure that everyone can keep a safe distance from one another. This means that anyone who plans to attend Christmas Eve

worship must contact the church office by phone or email to reserve a spot. If you do not make a reservation, you may be turned away due to limited space. All other safety precautions that have been in place for Sunday worship will be maintained.

The pandemic COVID-19 should not be seen as the grinch who steals our Christmas celebrations. Yes, it has placed a dark cloud over the joys many want to celebrate at this festive time. But the pandemic cannot stop the good news of God's love which was proclaimed at Bethlehem. The good news came to shepherds watching over the flocks of sheep at night thinking no one cared about them. Since then the good news of the birth of a saviour has been proclaimed throughout generations who have endured war, plague, economic uncertainty and even to us during a pandemic. With these bequests we were able to add funds to the current account, pay for capital projects and support the benevolence fund of the Synod.

We are in the process of planning Christmas services, and with COVID-19 it is difficult. Niagara has just entered the

Orange stage, and it is hard to predict what our area will be like in a month from now.

The efforts of many people keep our doors open. Again, a thank you to Pastor, Lily, Sylvia and Bob for assisting our worship; to Jen who keeps the church sanitized so that we may worship safely; and to Norm for his almost daily check of the parsonage as it remains vacant.

The year 2021, which marks the 145th anniversary of our church, will see some changes. Pastor Jukka plans to retire soon, and we have a call committee in place consisting of Bob Hansen, Dianne Yungblut and Melanie Funk Laskaris, who will work in conjunction with First Lutheran to facilitate this transition. Perhaps we will see improvement with COVID-19 in the Niagara Region, and be able to celebrate and honor these milestones with fewer restrictions.

I appreciate all of you for your continued support and prayers for each other and for St. Matthew's.

## ADVENT AND CHRISTMAS WORSHIP

The Advent Season is a time of anticipation and excitement as we watch and wait for Christmas. This year the first Sunday of Advent falls on November 29, 2020. Throughout the four Sundays in Advent we will light the Advent candles during the worship service as we prepare to welcome the Christ-child. While we are still in the Amber stage of worship, planning for our Christmas season must be done with great care and consideration. We will create a planned seating arrangement to ensure that we can make the most efficient use of our space while still maintaining a 2 metre separation of all social bubbles. Reservations will be available on a first-come, first-served basis and we will try to post weekly updates on seating availability throughout December.
