Pastor's Message

We are now celebrating one hundred years of serving our Master in Welland. During that time, our Loving God has nourished St. Matthew's family with both Word and Sacrament to provide spiritual growth and a steady increase in numbers. The accomplishments of this congregation result from the efforts of pastors and people who have been abundantly blessed.

There have been times of discouragement. In a booklet published for the Fifty-Fifth Anniversary of St. Matthew's, the Rev. S. Gartung wrote: The occasion is unique because it is also the fifth anniversary of the determination to live. For a period of practically fifty years the congregation did not have a resident pastor. For many years there was no pastoral oversight. The mircale really is that the congregation was sustained.

We do desire, for the above reason, to keep the two-fold nature of this anniversary in mind - the first half of a century, and the first lap of the second half. It is our confirmed opinion that God has favoured us with a new outlook, an outlook wherein a new opportunity of serving Him is granted.

Pastor Gartung's words seem prophetic. It was during the second fifty years that the visions and hopes of the organizers began to materialize. This was an era of opportunity, and God blessed the efforts of both people and pastors by multiplying the size of our Christian family and increasing the scope of its ministry.

The completion of one hundred years of ministering in the name of Christ must not in any way prompt a feeling of having finished the work entrusted to us. We have been stewards of God's treasures and shall continue in this trust as long as He provides the necessary strength. Our age must not suggest retirement, but a form of conditioning which prepares us for more strenuous accomplishments in the days and years to come. The past history of the congregation serves to indicate that we can share and anticipate great things if we seek to serve our Lord. In Him is life for the individual and also for the congregation committed to His Gospel. St. Matthew's in Welland will continue to live and prosper so long as the members are faithful servants of God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.


Our History

Many of the German families who settled in the Niagara Peninsula were groups of people from Alsace and neighbouring districts, or United Empire Loyalists from the environs of Pennsylvania. On February 24, 1876, a small group of these German speaking Lutherans organized under the direction of the Rev. F. C. Ebinger, a circuit preacher, into the congregation of St. Matthew's, Welland. Moving quickly, the fledgling congregation purchased the present church site from Hooker and Asher for \$75.00 and proceeded with their plans to erect the first permanent Lutheran Church building in Welland.

Through collections and subscriptions \$600.00 was raised, and the cornerstone was laid on May 7, 1876. Contractors erected a wooden structure, measuring 40 feet by 28 feet, which served St. Matthew's for over 50 years until it was replaced by the present building in 1928.

The first 50 years of service of St. Matthew's were not easy ones. Gradually as the older members of the congregation died, and families moved away, the congregation shrank in size until there were only six families who were members of St. Matthew's. The arrival of a field missionary, Dr. M. J. Bieber, in 1913 reversed this trend, and the year 1926 saw the congregation call its first full-time pastor, the Rev. S. Gartung. During his pastorate the 50th anniversary of the founding of the congregation was celebrated and plans were made for the erection of a new church building. The cornerstone of the new church was laid on August 19, 1928, and the dedication service was conducted on December 4 of that year.

The past fifty years have seen an expansion of Christ's ministry under the direction of Pastors S. Gartung (1926–1936), S. Cooper (1937–1942), F. Mueller (1942–1945), C. Cronmiller (1945–1953), R. Tubbe (1954–1959), M. Innes (1960–1963), P. Fischer (1964–1965), H. Lindeman (1965–1972) and R.L.P. Burgoyne (1973 –). In 1958, several members who had worshipped in the original church participated in a sod-turning ceremony for the addition of a Fellowship Hall and Sunday School rooms, plus extensive renovations to the church proper.




First Church Building

To complete a block of property fronting on Griffith, Kent and Regent Streets, the following purchases were made: a house and lot on Kent Street in 1942, a house and lot on Griffith Street in 1956, and a lot on Regent Street in the same year. This provided space for a new parsonage built on Griffith Street in 1965, and a sizable parking lot on Kent and Regent Streets. A new organ was dedicated on March 31, 1968.

The history of the congregation of St. Matthew's cannot be told merely in a recording of dates and events, but rather through the living witness of those members who preceded us. The families whose pictures and names appear in this book are also part of the past history, as well as the future history of St. Matthew's which remains to be written. Let us pray that we remain as faithful to our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ as those who came before us.




